## Emergency/Urgent Care Medicine Development

**Anterior Superior Alveolar Block**

**Clinical**

- Anesthetizes the maxillary canine, central and lateral incisors, and mucosa above these teeth with occasional crossover to the contralateral maxillary incisors

**Landmarks**

- Locate the mucobuccal fold above the tooth by grasping the membrane with gauze and pulling out and down

**Procedure**

- Apply topical anesthesia to site
- Insert needle into the intersection of the mucobuccal fold and the apex/center of the canine at a **45-degree angle**, and advance the needle approximately 1-1.5 cm
- Aspirate
- Slowly inject 2 mL of local anesthetic and massage for 10-20 seconds

**Anterior Superior Alveolar Block**

**Clinical**

- Anesthetizes the maxillary canine, central and lateral incisors, and mucosa above these teeth with occasional crossover to the contralateral maxillary incisors

**Landmarks**

- Locate the mucobuccal fold above the tooth by grasping the membrane with gauze and pulling out and down

**Procedure**

- Apply topical anesthesia to site
- Insert needle into the intersection of the mucobuccal fold and the apex/center of the canine at a **45-degree angle**, and advance the needle approximately 1-1.5 cm
- Aspirate
- Slowly inject 2 mL of local anesthetic and massage for 10-20 seconds
